Feedback from Teachers on a 5 point scale was collected to analyse their perception and satisfaction level on the curriculum and working condition of the college. A summarised version of various parameters are noted below

- The Summary Report of Teachers Feedback on Curriculum and Working Conditions in the college in pdf format was sent to the Principal, all HODs, all departments, and the NAAC Coordinator via e-mail on 18/05/2023 for their general information and for taking necessary measures in this regard.
- 2) The mean score of curriculum related questions was found to be 4.01 and therefore it is presumed that teachers have generally given a positive affirmation (Good to Very Good) on the curriculum
- 3) The mean score of Courses and Syllabus (12 questions) was reported to be 3.81 (
 Satisfactory to Good) which means teachers are generally satisfied with the
 courses and syllabus provided by the University
- 4) Teachers provided a mean score of 3.51 (Average to Easy) on the Difficulty Level of Course Contents
- 5) The Mean Score of Internal Evaluation Components (10 queries) was found to be 3.81 (Neutral to Satisfactory on a 5 point Likert Scale). Therefore it was construed that teachers are generally satisfied with the internal evaluation components.
- 6) Teachers provided a mean score of 3.74 (Neutral to Satisfactory on a 5 point Likert scale) on the External Evaluation of University. Therefore it can be inferred that the teachers are generally satisfied with the External Evaluation Procedure.
- 7) The Mean Score of College Infrastructure as provided by the teachers was calculated as 4.25 (Satisfactory to Highly Satisfactory) and therefore it is presumed that they are satisfied with the current infrastructure of the college.
- 8) The Mean Score of Working Conditions in the College is found to be 4.53 (Satisfactory to Highly Satisfactory) and therefore it is interpreted that the teachers are generally satisfied with working condition existing in the college.
- 9) Major suggestions received from the teachers includes:
 - a. Curriculum related suggestions such as modification of syllabus according to the latest trends, simplification and content reduction of certain courses, regular revision of syllabus, incorporating internship and onsite training, timely conduct of exams, etc.
 - Provision of internet facility through campus Wi-Fi, Centralised computer lab facility, improving facilities in the college canteen, provision of staff quarters, hostel facility for boy students, etc.
 - Suggestions for improving academic environment consist of adherence to academic calendar, improving teacher –student relations, etc.
- 10) A meeting of Principal, IQAC Coordinator and NAAC Coordinator was held on 25/05/2023 and the summary report was discussed and deliberated and the following decisions were taken on the suggestions provided by teachers:
 - a. Teachers and HODs of department should sit together to prepare a write-up on the possible suggestions regarding the improvement of curriculum, Courses and Syllabus, reducing the difficulty level of certain course contents, changes in the

internal and external evaluation components and the write-up so received from departments can be sent to the concerned Board of Studies of the University of Calicut. The general suggestions such as regular updating of course syllabi, timely conduct of exams, opportunity for internship and practical training, etc are also to be communicated to the university authorities so that such things can be addressed during the next syllabus/curriculum revision.

- b. Decided to refer the matter of providing more opportunities for research and publications, including the scope of publishing an interdisciplinary journal of the college to the Research Committee of the college and formulating an Action Plan in this regard.
- c. Decided to refer suggestions of the teachers to the College Staff Council for taking appropriate measures for addressing issues and betterment of working conditions.

Feedback of exit students (2023 pass-out batch) to analyse the perception and satisfaction level of students on the curricular activities and educational ambiance of the college was collected. Rating Scale of 1 to 5 was used for the feedback on 30 aspects, in which 5 was kept as the highest score and 1 the lowest score. 132 students responded and the summary of the same is presented below, along with the action taken thereon.

- All the 30 aspects of exit feedback had a mean score above 3 (The cut-off score was identified as 3). Therefore it was construed that students were generally satisfied with the academic environment of the college.
- Summary Report of the Exit Feedback was prepared and duly communicated via email to the Principal, all departments, all HODs and NAAC Coordinator on 17/05/2023
- 3) Responses from students on the open-ended questions such as positive aspect, negative aspect and suggestions were also placed in the summary report so as to reflect upon it, by the Principal and HODs and do the needful to address such issues.
- 4) A meeting of the available members of IQAC was held on 25/05/2023 to discuss the summary report of students exit feedback. The following were decided on it:
 - a. It was decided to reinforce and revitalise the positive aspects of the college as pointed out by the students for improving the satisfaction level.
 - b. Points raised by the students as negative aspect of the college were discussed, deliberated and was decided to take remedial measures to overcome the same.
 - c. As some of the points required further deliberation by the College Staff Council, it was decided to refer such matters to the Council
 - d. Student suggested points of improvement were discussed and decided to incorporate some of the relevant suggestions in the future course of action.
 - e. It was decided to give instruction to the cleaning staff regarding the maintenance of the washrooms and premises.
 - f. Decided to refer the matter of improvement of canteen and cafeteria to the Canteen Advisory Committee and Staff Council for betterment of facilities there.
 - g. It was decided to refer the matter of more facilities for sports and games as suggested by the students to the HOD of Physical Education
 - h. It was decided to refer the matter of infrastructural issues to the Planning Committee/ Building Committee/ Purchase Committee as the case may be.

- 1) The Summary Report of Parents Feedback in pdf format was sent via e-mail to the Principal, all departments, all HODs and the NAAC Coordinator for their information and further remedial measures on 18/05/2023.
- 2) It was found from the analysis that most of the parents are satisfied with the academic and administrative environment existing in the college.

- 3) The mean score in all the 23 feedback elements was found to be above 3 and therefore it can be presumed that there exists a favourable and positive opinion on the facilities available in the college.
- 4) Major Suggestions from the parents include
 - a. Regular and Frequent interaction between teachers and parents
 - b. Betterment of college canteen and cafeteria
 - c. Starting of new courses and innovative programmes for higher studies
 - d. Increased facilitation for sports and games
 - e. Increased support for arts and cultural activities and events
 - f. Improvement of cleanliness and hygiene inside the washrooms/ toilets
- 5) All the suggestions provided by the parents were discussed at the meeting of available members of IQAC on 25/05/2023 and the following decisions were taken:
 - a. College Staff Council, on the reopening of the college, will take decision on the regular and scheduled parents' interaction through Class PTA (Online and Offline), Connecting parents through social media platforms, Involvement of parents in the events and programmes inside the campus on possible extent.
 - b. Decided to refer the matter of improving facilities in the college canteen to the Canteen Advisory Committee.
 - c. Decided to have proper communication with authorities including elected representatives (MLA/MP) on the need and requirement of starting new UG/ PG programmes in the college.
 - d. HOD of Physical Education Department was asked to take appropriate measures for the improved facilities for sports and games for the benefit of students.
 - e. It was decided to refer the matter to offer an increased support for arts and cultural activities to the collective decision of the College Staff Council and devise a plan of action for the same.
 - f. Cleaning staff were instructed to maintain cleanliness and hygiene of the washroom and toilets. For the purpose of ensuring regular cleaning, a committee consisting of teachers and student representatives will be formed and they will be delegated to check the cleaning activity by maintaining proper records (Cleaning Charts/ Logs)



- 1) Summary report of individual teachers after including the suggested points as reported by students was prepared, and the soft copy of the same in pdf format was forwarded to their personal e-mail address
- 2) Teachers were asked to reflect upon the summary feedback in all the major areas including the points raised by students on the positive aspect, negative aspect, points of suggestions, etc.
- 3) Teachers were individually invited for a scheduled online meeting (through Google Meet platform) in order to discuss and deliberate on the summary feedback of students and to frame necessary strategies for betterment. The personalised meeting had Principal, IQAC Co-ordinator, NAAC Co-ordinator and the concerned teacher as participants. The schedule of meeting was:

 - i. 23-05-2023 (10 am to 11 am)
- Teacher of Physical Education Departments (1 Teacher): e.
 - i. 23-05-2023 (11 am to 11:20 am)
- Teachers of Microbiology Department (Including Biostatistics and Computer f. Application - 8 Teachers): tow.
 - i. 23-05-2023 (2:30 pm to 4:00 pm)
- Teacher of Biochemistry Department (1 Teacher) : g.
 - i. 23-05-2023(4 pm to 4:20 pm)
- 4) In the Online meet, Principal, IQAC and NAAC Co-ordinators gave their suggestions for the improvement of the teachers performance and advised the need of student engagements through Ed-Tech. platforms
- 5) As some of the students expressed their concern on the difficult nature of the subject/ course contents/ certain module in the curriculum/ syllabi, etc. and the teachers were asked to prepare a write-up on the same along with suggested points of changes or modification, so as to send it to the Board of Studies of the concerned subject.
- 6) The general suggestions agreed upon by the teachers in the review meeting included measures such as intense use of ICT in teaching learning, use of latest tools for student engagements, gaming and quizzing, use of blended learning wherever possible, encouraging students to enrol in MOOC courses, etc.
- 7) Regarding the difficulties on the course content as pointed out by the students and duly endorsed by the course teacher through the write-up, it was decided to forward the matter to the Board of Studies of the concerned subject for necessary consideration and possible adjustments in the course syllabi in the ensuing revision.
